As part of its year-long focus on the call of Pope Francis to care for our common home, the Earth, Holy Trinity Church (501 Cherrywood Road) will host a panel discussion about food and its meaning, preservation, storage, and disposal. This will be held on Wednesday, January 17, at 7:00 p.m. in the Multipurpose Building. Experts in the areas of theology, the environment, food preparation and storage, and composting will discuss these issues and offer practical steps for individuals and families. Speaker Tim Darst of Kentucky Interfaith Power and Light will discuss why reducing food waste is a sacred act. Chef Hank Levitt of the Common Table will present ideas on purchasing and storing food to reduce waste, and Bethany Pratt of the Jefferson County Cooperative Extension Office will talk about how to compost.
